1. Purpose of the report

Te Take moo te puurongo

To inform the Community Committee about the safety improvement work to be done at Main Road Te Kauwhata.

2. Executive summary

Whakaraapopotanga matua

Safety improvement work to be done at Main Road, Te Kauwhata, which involves.

1. Removal of pedestrian crossing in front of New World, which is currently creating confusion and discouraging people from using the main existing pedestrian crossing.
 2. In addition, two car parks identified in the attached plan will be removed considering it is the safety concern for the pedestrians as it on blind spot.
 3. This also needs repainted on the ground to improve the visibility of crossing and car parks.
 4. Two new car parks will be introduced in front and opposite of New World to balance the number of car parks on Main Road, as shown in plan.
 5. Speed cushions will be installed either side of road crossing to reduce the speed of heavy traffic.
 6. Last 6 hit-sticks/bollards on west side will be replaced with new ones.
 7. Direction tactiles indicators to be installed on either side of pedestrian crossing.

3. Background Koorero whaimaarama

Council has been informed of numerous safety/incident near misses from vehicle reversing from car parks and the vehicle coming downhill from Waeranga Road which are not slowing down to give way to pedestrians on crossing.

Also, two crossing is creating confusion and safety risk for pedestrians.

4. Next steps Ahu whakamua

Council will be engaging with the community for the feedback. Once the plan is approved, quick action will be taken to start the improvement work for community safety.
