4. Parks and Facilities Presentation.

Tony Whitaker introduced Andrew Corkill who is the "Parks and Facilites" Manager for WDC.

Andrew outlined his role at WDC, with a team of 20, overseeing up to 50 sites, playgrounds, mowing sports fields, neighbourhood parks ,cycleways, beaches ,cemetery's etc.

Andrew team, also forward plan,eg "How to plan for future Parks (strategy's) playgrounds, cemetery's ?In essence ,future planning forms part of the WDC Parks strategic framework. Example:

Pokeno Domain, Avon Road, is under developed, earmarked as 'Dog exercise area! What about future potential?

I. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Every three years Council must prepare and adopt a Long Term Plan. The next Long Term Plan will be adopted for the years 2018-28. As a part of this Long Term Plan we want to engage with our communities to find out what projects they would like to see occur in their communities.

The purpose of this report is to introduce Pokeno Community Committee to begin the process of establishing those projects that may be included in the Long Term Plan.



3. BACKGROUND

Every three years Council must prepare and adopt a Long Term Plan. The purpose of the Long Term Plan is to set Council's strategic direction for the next 10 years – this includes projects they wish to undertake over that time.

Other Community Boards and Committees have been through the process to establish priority projects for their communities. Every three years each of the Community Boards and Committees will get an opportunity to review these projects.

The diagram below outlines the process for establishing priority projects.



4. DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS OF OPTIONS

4.1 DISCUSSION

Some examples of the priority projects established by other Community Committees include new toilet blocks and playgrounds, parking in the CBD and roading and footpath upgrades.

The Pokeno Community Committee can choose to come up with the projects alone or staff can facilitate a workshop style meeting with the Committee to assist with this.

5. CONSIDERATION

Not all projects in the priority list will be able to be funded by Council and projects will have to go through the Long Term Plan engagement process to determine what projects may receive funding or support from Council.
