#### Programme Outline: Children and Youth Arts Workshops

#### **Children Workshops**

The aim is to provide after school arts workshops in 2013/ 2014 for children in Raglan Whaingaroa. The range of workshops includes; drama, painting, murals, pottery, jewellery making, knitting, print making, and elay art. We employ experienced tutors and where possible use volunteer assistants. We have been vetted by CYP and have OSCAR certification.

#### Who will benefit and what areas do the participants come from?

Children from the Raglan Whaingaroa area including children whose families would not normally be able to afford the cost of them attending art classes. Classes in Raglan mean that parents do not have to drive their children to Hamilton. There will be after school workshops of each type for the four terms in each year.

#### How will they benefit?

Children will learn new skills and gain greater confidence in their ability to express themselves through artistic media. The provision of traditional Maori arts will improve cross culture knowledge. The wider community will benefit through the provision of constructive and educational, after-school activities.

#### Youth Workshops

The aim is to provide after school arts workshops during 2013/ 2014 for youths in Raglan Whaingaroa. In the past we have provided bone carving workshops focussing on Maori youth and we plan to repeat this as there is a demand for them. We also ran a course on clay art. In 2014 we plan to run video making, hip hop and drama workshops for youth. The courses are design to meet the needs of individual youth learners in a supportive and flexible environment. We employ experienced tutors and where possible use volunteer assistants. We have been vetted by CYP and have OSCAR certification.

#### Who will benefit and what areas do the participants come from?

Youths from the Raglan Whaingaroa area including youths whose families would not normally be able to afford the cost of them attending art classes. Classes in Raglan mean that parents do not have to drive to Hamilton for classes.

#### How will they benefit?

Youths will improve their skills, increase their knowledge and gain greater confidence in their ability to express themselves through a wide variety of artistic media. The provision of traditional Maori arts will improve cross culture knowledge. The wider community will benefit through the provision of constructive and educational, after-school activities.

#### Feedback on Children and Youth Workshops from interested parties regarding plans

At our community feedback forums and member's meetings many people identified after-school for children and youth. The Raglan Naturally community plan supports the provision of children's and youth workshops at the Arts Centre. A 'student voice' activity has been undertaken at Raglan Area School to determine what activities youth are interested in. Cost is sometimes a barrier especially for at risk families and subsidised classes definitely allow more children to participate. Past classes have been well attended and parents continue to ask for classes to be repeated. This year we are increasing the kids clay art after school classes from 2 afternoons to 3 per week.

#### What do you want to do?

Last year I ran 'Funked up Junk' a two day upcycle workshop for kids, it was received extremely well and ran to plan. This year I would like to do the same and run it like I did last year, now that I know what works and how best to run it.

The workshop will teach kids to reuse rather than having a throw away mentality. The kids by using found objects e.g bits of furniture, cake tins, suitcases, fabrics, wallpaper, national geographic etc pulling together all these bits and pieces and transforming the objects into pieces of art.

They will learn skills in using hand tools, different methods in paint application, attaching cutting, stencilling e.t.c, they will also learn to problem solve and a bit of kiwi ingenuity, various methods of creativity.

They all get to take away their own inventions at the end of the workshop, works constructed by none other than themselves.

All tutors and helpers will come from **75** reative or teaching background ensuring that they will have plenty of skills to impart onto students.

Choosing not to have too many students so kids get plenty of one on one time with tutors, to create a safe well managed environment where kids get the attention to it make beneficial to them.

Sustainable September – is run through the 'Whaingaroa Environment Centre' once a year, a community based program run for the month of September where there is a line-up of people within the community that offer a large variety of workshops all related to sustainability to pass on their knowledge and share with others involving the wider community.
