I. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The purpose of this report is to present an application for funding from the Bush Tramway Club Inc. ("the Club") towards the cost of installing two water filtering systems.

3. BACKGROUND

The Club's purpose is to preserve heritage railway items from the coal and timber industries and to preserve and display these items to the public and for future generations.

Reporting Entity

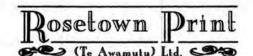

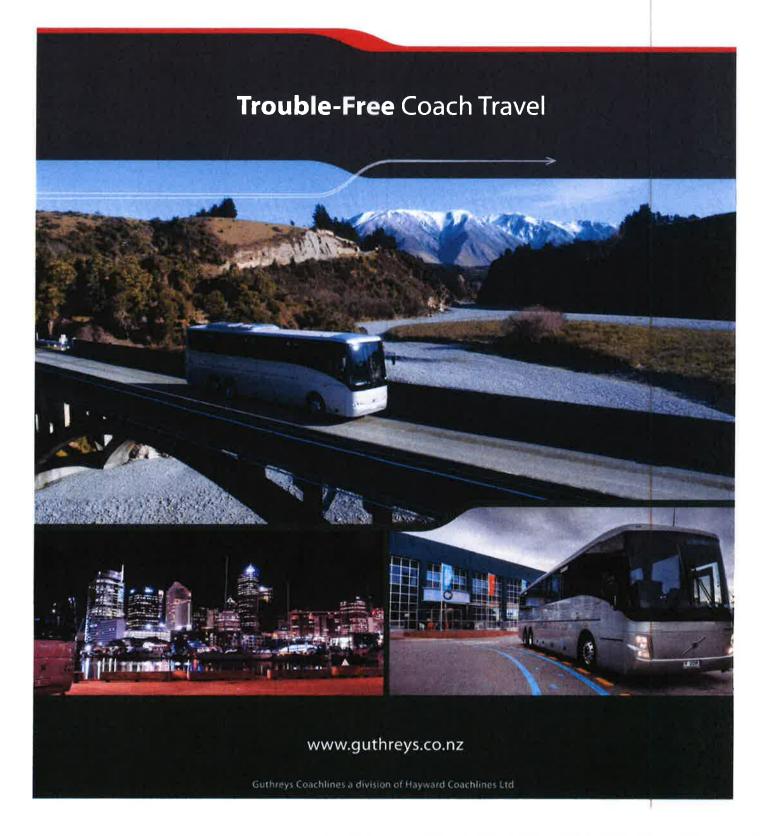

The purpose of this report is to present an application for funding from the Waikato Rowing Club Committee towards the cost of the 2018 Waikato 100 Event.

3. BACKGROUND

The Waikato Rowing Club Committee ('the Committee') is organising the 2018 Waikato 100 Event ("the Event").

The Event is a time trial (racing against the clock) with optional relay stops at Ngaruawahia (20km), Rangiriri (50km) and Mercer (75km), and is estimated to take 5-10 hours to complete.

The event aims to include:

- Healthy participation in physical activity;

Waikato Rowing Club Incorporated (henceforth, "the Club") is an incorporated society registered under the Incorporated Societies Act 1908.

Measurement Base

The accounting principles recognised as appropriate for the measurement and reporting of earnings and financial position on an historical cost basis are followed.

Basis of Preparation

The Club has elected to apply PBE SFR-A (NFP) Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting - Accrual (Not-For-Profit) on the basis that it does not have public accountability and has total annual expenses of equal to or less than \$2,000,000. All transactions in the Performance Report are reported using the accrual basis of accounting. The Performance Report is prepared under the assumption that the entity will continue to operate in the foreseeable future.

Revenue

Revenue is accounted for as follows:

Fundraising and grants

Fundraising and Grant Income is accounted for depending on whether or not it has a "use or return' condition attached. Where no use or return conditions are attached, the revenue is recorded as income when the cash is received. Where revenue includes a use or return condition, it is initially recorded as liability on receipt. The revenue is then subsequently recognised within the Statement of Financial Performance as the performance conditions are met.

Donations

Donations are accounted for depending on whether they have been provided with a "use or return" condition attached. Where no use or return conditions are attached to the donation, revenue is recorded as income when the cash is received. Where donations include a use or return condition, the donation is intially recorded as a liability on receipt. The donation is subsequently recognised within the Statement of Financial Performance as the performance conditions are met.

Donated goods or services (other than donated assets) are not recognised.

Membership revenue

Fees and subscriptions received in exchange for monthly access to member's facilities are intially recorded as revenue in advance and recognised in revenue evently over the membership period.

Other fees and subscriptions ar recorded as revenue when cash is received.

Interest revenue

Interest revenue is recognised on an accruals basis.

Other revenue

All other revenue is accounted for on an accrual basis and accounted for in accordance with the substance of the transaction.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

The Club is registered for GST and the financial statements are prepared on a GST exclusive basis, except for debtors & creditors which are GST inclusive.

Income Tax

The Club is exempt from taxation under section CW46 of the income Tax Act 2007 as the derived revenue is for the purpose to promote an amateur sport which is conducted for the recreation or entertainment of the general public.

Bank Accounts and Cash

Bank accounts and cash in the Statement of Cash Flows comprise cash balances and bank balances (including short ferm deposits) with original maturities of 90 days or less.

Accounts Receivable

Accounts Receivable are valued at their estimated realisable value after providing against debts where collection is doubtful.

Inventory

Clothing

Singlets and row suits are stated at the lower of cost, determined on a first in first out basis, and net realisable value.

Livestock

Livestock inventory has been recorded at market value at balance date.

Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment are initially recorded at cost less aggregate depreciation and have not been revalued.

Depreciation

Depreciation has been calculated on a dimishing value basis using the following rates:

Buildings	5%
Racing plants	10%
Oars and sculls	10%
Training equipment	10%
Furniture and sundry equipment	10%

Changes in Accounting Policies

The Incorporated Society transitioned on 1 April 2014 from preparation of general-purpose financial information in accordance with New Zealand generally accepted accounting practice ("NZ GAAP") to Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting - Accrual (Not-For-Profit) PBE SFR-A (NFP) in accordance with the new PBE reporting framework. The transition had minimal impact on the accounting policies of the Incorporated Society.

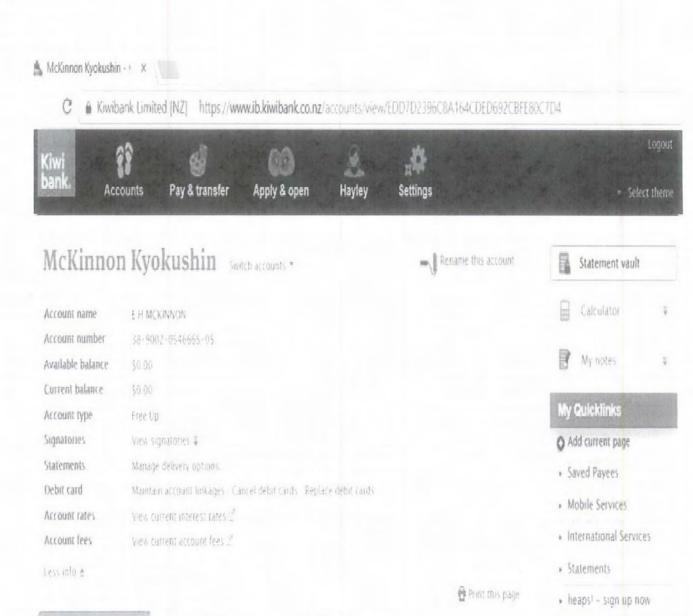

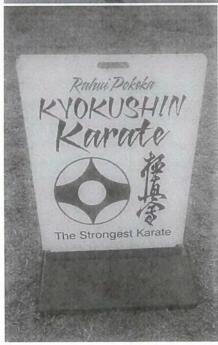
