Report Title	Proposed 2018 Amendments to the Waikato District Council Speed Limits Bylaw 2011

I. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Council is currently reviewing its bylaw relating to the Speed Limits within the Waikato District. In accordance with the Speed Bylaw Review Policy and the New Zealand Transport Agency ("NZTA") Speed Management Framework this review has included sites that were identified as having a self-explaining priority and located within Area Two of the district (Mid Waikato). Ring-fencing of local settlements and the provision of a hierarchy of speed limits within country living zones has been undertaken as a result of community led requests.

Early engagement feedback was sought on roads that Council staff had identified for change. Key stakeholders such as NZTA, adjacent local authorities, Road Transport Association, Police, AA and Waikato District Community Boards and Committees were included in this early engagement. The purpose of engagement with the Community Boards was to gauge public opinion prior to public consultation. Feedback from this early engagement is an integral part of developing the proposed Bylaw and resulted from this changes have been made.

Council is now required to consult on all proposed changes using the special consultative procedure as outlined in the Local Government Act 2002 ("LGA 2002").

The proposed Bylaw (which includes a District Wide schedule) is attached along with the Statement of Proposal for consideration (see Appendix 3). Subject to approval, the proposed Bylaw will be publicly notified on 9 October with submissions being open until 9 November 2018. Submissions on the proposed Bylaw will be considered and, if requested, heard by Council at a meeting on 12 December 2018 or as early thereafter as possible. The Bylaw is scheduled to be confirmed by Council at a meeting to be held on 11 February 2019.

2. **RECOMMENDATION**

THAT the report of the General Manager Service Delivery be received;

AND THAT the Committee recommends to Council that it make a determination that the proposed bylaw does not give rise to any implications under the New Zealand Bill of Rights Act 1990 pursuant to section 155(2) of the Local Government Act 2002;

AND FURTHER THAT the Statement of Proposal, incorporating the proposed Waikato District Council Speed Limits Bylaw 2011 (subject to any amendments), be approved for public notification on 9 October 2018 with the closing date for submissions being 9 November 2018, in accordance with Sections 83 (special consultative procedure), and 86 (use of special consultative procedure in relation to adoption or review or amendment of bylaws) of the Local Government Act 2002;

AND FURTHER THAT submissions on the Statement of Proposal (incorporating the proposed 2018 Amendments to the Waikato District Council Speed Limits Bylaw 2011) be considered and, if requested, be heard by Council at a meeting to be held on 12 December 2018 or as early thereafter as possible.

3. BACKGROUND

Council adopted the guidance provided in the NZTA Speed Management Guide as part of a new Speed Bylaw Review Policy ("the Policy") in June 2017. Adopting this Policy formalised the Speed Bylaw Review process. The Policy sets out an approach that splits the District in three areas, with the roads identified as being high to medium-high self-explaining priority by the NZTA Speed Management Framework maps addressed one area per year over a three year time frame with the ability to consider ad hoc roads as required. The wards to be reviewed in 2018 are: Huntly; Hukanui-Waerenga; and Ngaruawahia.

In June 2018 the New Zealand Government indicated in its Government Policy Statement on Land Transport 2018/19-2027/28 a desire to reduce road trauma on New Zealand roads. To this end the GPS states that:

"Investment should improve safety for all users through ensuring safe and appropriate travel speeds, and improving roads, roadsides and intersections. In particular, GPS 2018 supports investment in state highways and local roads to accelerate the implementation of the new Speed Management Guide, focusing on treating the top 10 percent of the network which will result in the greatest reduction in death and serious injury as quickly as possible (such as reviewing speed limits and/or making engineering improvements to make a road safe for its current speed limit)....."

In addition the

"GPS 2018 supports policy development in key areas, including:

• ensuring safer and appropriate speeds, including around schools;

- improving the safety of active transport modes, including rules for what types of vehicles should be allowed on footpaths, cycleways, shared paths and roadways, and under what conditions; and
- reviewing regulatory barriers to accelerate the implementation of the speed management guide....'

The original intent of the Speed Bylaw Review Policy was to:

- 1. Focus on the top 5-10% High Risk Routes within the District Self Explaining Roads;
- 2. Consolidate Urban Extents by ring fencing the areas already currently under development and those identified as where development is most likely to occur in the near future; and
- 3. Review the ad-hoc sites which have been raised during the previous consultation process and area of localised growth/ increased risk in the Huntly; Hukanui-Waerenga; and Ngaruawahia wards.

In response to the direction given by the government as part of GPS, community feedback and significant areas of development in both urban and country living zones, Council staff have elected to accelerate the review/implementation plan. This has resulted in some of the Year 3 wards being brought forward to cover issues such as the New Plan changes (Pokeno) developer led growth (eg Te Kowhai), Consolidate Urban Extents (Ring-Fencing), Rural Residential Zone Benchmark Area (Tamahere). In addition the effects of Waikato Expressway, and the HCC North Eastern area (Resolution/Borman Road/Kay Rd/River Rd) need to be addressed.

The review of the top high risk routes, the urban extents of local settlements and ad hoc sites, has been undertaken. This additional ring-fencing of the local settlements and the provision of a hierarchy of speed limits within country living zones has been undertaken as a result of community led requests and has resulted in these being extended to cover the Tamahere, and some of the Newcastle and Eureka Wards.

The Guide recommends early engagement with key stakeholders and affected communities to gauge the level of support for these types of speed limit alterations. Council commenced an early engagement process to seek community feedback between June and August 2018.

Early engagement feedback was sought from key stakeholders such as NZTA, adjacent local authorities, Road Transport Association, Police, AA, with representation of local communities from Waikato District Community Boards and Committees. The feedback received in this early engagement has been summarised in Appendix I of this report.

During the early engagement process, four roads were identified as having limited public support for speed reduction. A further review of these roads identified that additional safety improvements should be undertaken in the interim, to reduce the risk to road users in lieu of any proposal to reduce the speed limit. It was considered the roads required a greater level of signage, delineation and sight distance improvements

These roads were:

• Buckland Road – from Tuakau Road to 650m north of Geraghty Road.

- Hakarimata Road from 300m north of Brownlee Road to Riverview Road.
- Harrisville Road Mill Road to 320m south of Pook Road.
- Great South Road between Ngaruawahia and Horotiu.

In addition to the above, Waipa District Council requested that Bruntwood Road from Tauwhare Road to Mills Road be reduced from 100km/hr to 80km/hr to align with their proposed changes on the adjacent section of Bruntwood Road.

The speed limit on Tuakau Bridge-Port Waikato Road was the subject of a review in 2017. As a result of this review it was recommended that the current speed limit be maintained and the road be reassessed in 2018. To this end, additional safety improvement works have commenced and Council Staff are monitoring the effectiveness of these changes. At this stage no changes to the speed limit are recommended for Tuakau Bridge-Port Waikato Road and it has not been included in this year's consultation list.

All recommended changes to a speed limit are detailed on the spreadsheet in Appendix 2 These have been incorporated into the final decisions and recommended changes to the proposed bylaw which are included in the Statement of Proposal in Appendix 3 of this report.

Council is now required to formally consult on the proposed changes to the Speed Limit Bylaw Appendix 4 using the special consultative procedure outlined in the Local Government Act 2002.

4. DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS OF OPTIONS

4.1 DISCUSSION

The 2018 Speed Limit Bylaw Review was originally proposed to cover the identification of high risk roads and urban extents within the Huntly, Hukanui-Waerenga, and Ngaruawahia, wards. Due to public interest in the process following the 2017 review, requests have been made to Council to review the speed limits within the urban extents and country living zones in the Tamahere, Newcastle and Eureka Wards as well.

From the NZTA Speed Management Framework maps, a number of roads in the Waikato district have been identified as high risk with their current speed limits in place. Assessment criteria used to determine roads that fall into the high risk category by the Speed Management Framework tool include: alignment; carriageway width; roadside hazards; land use; traffic volume; crash history and the suitability of the existing speed limit. The sections of road identified in this proposal as being high risk, and therefore where the most safety gains could be made by reducing their speed limit were:

Buckland Rd Tuakau, Harrisville Rd Tuakau, Whangarata/Pokeno Rd, Ridge Rd Pokeno, River Road Horotiu, Horsham Downs Rd, Great South Rd Ngaruawahia, Hakarimata Rd Huntly, Osborne Rd, Kay Rd and Lake Rd.

Each year a number of sections of road are identified by members of the public, Police, Councillors and Council staff where for a variety of reasons including crash history, the existing speed limit is considered to be inappropriate. In addition there were a number of sections of road that adjoined sections that are proposed to be changed as a result of their being identified high risk roads. These roads are typically dead-end roads with lower volumes and narrower carriageways than the main road. These roads were assessed where possible using the same assessment criteria in the Speed Management Framework tool to determine if the existing speed limits were appropriate or not for these locations.

Rapid development in a number of locations across the district has resulted in roading construction occurring within residential areas that are not covered by an Urban Traffic Area. Due to the way the legislation is currently written, new roads are covered by two default speed limits until such time as a road is specified to have an alternative speed limit. The default speed limits are 50km/hr within Urban Traffic Areas or 100km/hr outside of these areas. A review has been undertaken of the main settlements within the Huntly, Hukanui-Waerenga, Ngaruawahia, Newcastle, Tamahere and Eureka wards. The proposed extension of the Urban Traffic Areas does not affect any current or proposed speed limits in these areas but will 'capture' any new roads built after the implementation of this bylaw.

4.2 **OPTIONS**

The options that have been identified are:

Option I: Do nothing

This option is **not** recommended.

This option would see no change to the existing speed limits on all sections of road within the district. From the analysis undertaken this is highly undesirable in a number of locations and could lead to higher crash rates and more severe crashes as drivers attempt to drive to limits considered undesirable due to the level of development or alignment of the road.

Option 2: Review and Update Bylaw <u>This option is recommended.</u> Following the early engagement and technical review of the roads identified it is recommended that the speed limit be reduced on the sections of road identified in Appendix 2.

The proposed Bylaw aligns with the purpose of LGA as defined in section 10(1)(b) that relates to the provision of good-quality local infrastructure, local public services, and performance of regulatory functions in a way that is most cost-effective for households and businesses. Provision of speed limits is a vital service that is best managed by local government to ensure consistency and affordability of the service.

It is recommended to proceed to consultation on the bylaw with these speed limits included.

5. CONSIDERATION

5.1 FINANCIAL

It is not envisaged that the proposed Bylaw will require any extra funding over that which is currently provided in operational budgets.

Identification of additional safety improvements through the review will have a cost implication but will be covered by existing budget.

Any fees and charges that are associated with this Bylaw will be set through the Long Term Plan.

5.2 LEGAL

Implications under the New Zealand Bill of Rights Act 1990

Section 155(2) of the LGA 2002 also requires the Council to determine whether the proposed bylaw "gives rise to any implications under the New Zealand Bill of Rights Act 1990". No bylaw may be inconsistent with this legislation.

The Bill of Rights Act 1990 details a number of rights and freedoms in relation to life and security of people.

It is the view of the staff preparing the proposed Bylaw that it is not considered to be inconsistent with or likely to give rise to any implications under the New Zealand Bill of Rights Act 1990. The Bylaw simply provides the regulatory means by which public places can be managed.

During this review process staff have made efforts to:

- Take account of improvements suggested by officers who manage and maintain the Bylaw within the Waikato district;
- Comply with the NZTA Speed Management Framework (including early community engagement such as those that live on the road, environmental groups, Community Boards and Committees;
- Have regard to similar bylaws in neighbouring authorities; and
- Ensure the Bylaw is fair, efficient and clearly understandable.

The making of the Bylaw is subject to a consultative procedure to enable individuals to participate in the process.

Local Government Act 2002 ("the Act")

The proposed Bylaw is considered to meet the requirements of Section 10 of the Act in relation to the purpose of local government, as management of public places provides essential means for Council to perform its regulatory and public health obligations. Having a bylaw for the management of speed limits is considered to be a cost effective way of ensuring that Council meets its statutory obligations.

5.3 STRATEGY, PLANS, POLICY AND PARTNERSHIP ALIGNMENT

The proposal to engage early, prior to consideration of any proposal for a bylaw review aligns with Council's Significance and Engagement Policy and the NZTA Speed Management Framework.

5.4 Assessment of Significance and Engagement Policy and of External Stakeholders

The Speed Limits Bylaw triggers Council's Significance and Engagement Policy as the Special Consultative Procedure is required.

STATEMENT OF PROPOSAL



2018 AMENDMENT TO THE WAIKATO DISTRICT COUNCIL SPEED LIMITS BY

This Statement of Proposal is prepared pursuant to sections 83, 86, 155 and 156 of the Act 2002 (LGA). This is a proposal to adopt amendments to the Waikato Speed Limits by aw 2011.

The Waikato District Council Speed Bylaw enables Council to review existing speed limits on District roads and assess for suitability against changes in safety and/or development/land use patterns.

Background

Council has previously adopted the guidance provided in the New Zealand Transport Agency (NZTA) Speed Management Guide as part of a new Speed Bylaw Review Policy. As a result Council decided to review all speed limits within the district over a 3 year process.

The New Zealand Government in the Government Policy Statement (GPS) for Land Transport released in June 2018 has indicated that they have a desire to reduce road trauma on New Zealand roads by investing in road safety improvements for all road users by ensuring safe and appropriate travel speeds and improving roads, roadsides and intersections. They have requested that the implementation of the new Speed Management Guide be accelerated.

In response to the above and significant areas of development in both urban and country living zones a review of the top 10% high risk routes; the urban extents of local settlements; and the implementation of lower speed limits on rural residential roads has been undertaken. In addition a number of sections of road were requested to be reviewed by members of the public, Councillors and Council staff for a variety of reasons.

All roads have been assessed against the criteria in the Speed Management Guide and the recommendations put out for early engagement to key stakeholders and the community via their Community Boards. The feedback received from this early engagement have resulted in proposed changes to the bylaw.

Reasons for the proposal

- effectively deal with issues associated with the management of speed limits in the District
- to align the bylaw with those of other local authorities and NZTA's Speed Management Guide
- respond to New Zealand Government requirement to reduce road trauma on local roads

Summary of Key Changes

Key proposed changes in the proposed Bylaw are attached in Appendix A.

Relevant Determinations by Council

Prior to making a bylaw, Council is required to assess whether a bylaw is the most appropriate way of addressing the perceived problem. In this case, a bylaw is considered to be the most appropriate mechanism as the provision of Speed Limit Bylaw is a vital service that is best managed by local government to ensure consistency and affordability of the service. A bylaw allows staff to effectively deal with the problems associated with the management of the district's speed limits. Not having a bylaw would lessen Council's ability to control and set standards around the management of the district's speed limits.

Council is also required to consider whether the proposed Bylaw gives rise to any implications under the New Zealand Bill of Rights Act 1990. In this case it is not considered that there are any such implications, the Bylaw simply provides the regulatory means by which cemeteries can be managed.

Consultation and submissions

Anyone can make a submission about the proposed Waikato District Council Speed Limit Bylaw Review 2018 and we encourage you to let us know your views.

What is a submission?

Submissions are a record of your views/preferences on a particular issue. By making a submission you can ensure that your voice is heard by councillors to assist them in their decision making. Submissions may be sent or given to the Council from any organisation or any member of the public during a time period specified by Council. In most cases submission forms are available at Council offices and libraries and on the 'Have your say' page of Council's website.
