Report Title | Port Waikato Community Hub

I. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Council is being asked to support a Port Waikato Community Hub building, which would be for mixed use including community events and surf lifesaving activities. At this stage, the support is via a letter with council considering whether a financial contribution will be made. It appears as if the project is supported by the community.

2. RECOMMENDATION

THAT this report be received;

AND THAT council provide a letter of support to Sunset Beach Surf Lifesaving club for the purpose of raising funds for a mixed use Port Waikato Community Hub

AND FURTHER THAT council consider funding for this project in due course.

3. BACKGROUND

Council has been in discussions with the Port Waikato community about the replacement of the community hall, as the current hall is threatened by coastal erosion. As part of considering options, council and the community have entered into discussions with Sunset Beach Surf Lifesaving Club about a mixed use joint facility.

4. DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS OF OPTIONS

4. I DISCUSSION

Attached is an email from the surf lifesaving club outlining their thoughts about the project. In discussions, the surf lifesaving club have indicated that they are seeking a contribution

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from council of about \$250,000, which could be paid through a targeted rate by the community. Discussions on this funding source have already started.

The immediate issue is to provide a letter of support which indicates:

- Support in principle, based on the mixed model being proposed;
- Recognition that this is a community project and has good community buy in;
- That no financial commitment has been made:
- Council will consider funding to support this project in the course of time.

Councillors need to decide to support this project and if the answer is yes then to either provide a letter of support or not.

Dear Alan

Thank you for your support last night at the OTCB meeting. We were delighted with the unanimous support from the Councillors and Board members present.

Attached is a PDF of the plans for the Community Hub. Our quantity surveyor is working on the cost estimates for the build of the new Hub.

Our proposal originally for a Lifesaving facility has now moved in the interests of the community for a mixed use facility. Combining the Surf Lifesaving Facility and the Community Hub most importantly it is predicated on what is now widely recognised as accepted best practise. Our explorative work with the Auckland University Architecture School and consultation with

the wider community clearly states our plans for a mixed use facility are correct.

This approach is well understood and popularly supported in many local authority jurisdictions nationwide. It is the key to unlocking a complex funding framework that involves several institutions contributing matching funding.

The Sunset Beach Surf Lifesaving Charitable Trust are seeking a contribution from the WDC that is twofold in its purpose.

- 1. Funding towards upgrading Lifesaving facilities to strengthen the club and its operational capabilities in the face of imminent beach visitor growth in the region.
- 2. Funding towards delivery of the mixed use Community Hub ammenities that will result in funding from the NZLGBand Trust Waikato.

We discussed in the time available to us last night "High Points" only of the project and with your support we would seek a meeting with WDC staff at the appropriate time which will allow us to drill down to the business end of the project and most importantly to set timetables.

Therefore I do not propose in this email to go into the build, how the current hall comes into play and the structure of managing the project. As requested last night I will provide you with estimates and fundraising to date which will assist you at your Council meeting tomorrow.

The NZLGB have confirmed unequivocally that in order to access a National NZLGB Grant towards the facility It must be of mixed use. They no longer differentiate between funding of the Surf Club elements or the mixed use elements- they need to see evidence of a mixed use development which they will then fund the "One" building.

In other words if there is no mixed use element the NZLGB will not contribute.

The final piece that comes into play is the WDC demonstrating support for the project by way of written confirmation. This will be included in our NZLGB presentation.

The quantity surveyor that we have contracted made contact with me tonight with his estimate project funding based on the plans we submitted.

He emphasised that all materials have been included at retail level and they do not allow for FOC supplier contribution.

The estimate is \$1.8 million

Fundraising to date and targeted project funding.
