#### **5. REPORTS**

#### **5.1 POKENO WORKS &ISSUES:**

# Gavin Donald update to the community regarding North Waikato Sport and Recreation Needs Assessment.

Gavin presented that North Waikato Sport had talked and consulted with schools and clubs about the need to access space and good facilities. The recommendation was for Pokeno that the 'Munro" road block was essential as a hub and to promote future sports club growth. Currently Pokeno had approx. 11 hectares allocated space, but in fact needs by 2045, 33 hectares of accessible space.

Key to this was the Munro block in the medium term, for possible cricket and football activities.

Kevin Stokes added that currently Council was seeking a stormwater report, re flooding and accessibility to the Munro block.

Kevin said if the Munro Block was deemed unsuitable for purpose, then the alternatives are 3 years away, in the interim maybe Tennis club revival, with similar multi type sports within a small facility!

The stormwater report will be available for the May meeting as will the OPUS report.

# Jason Marconi, presentation Volunteer Recognition Award.

Jason is the District Coordinator for Sport Waikato ,his role is help council set up facilities for communities and to connect .He presented Marlene Lynarn with a Sports Jacket/top in honour of her commitment setting up a 'hiking club 'in Pokeno .He said Marlene was an incredible hostess, organiser and she went out of her way to involve 'all' levels of walkers and walks within an hour or so of Pokeno.

#### Foot path ZIGZAG

Kevin informed the meeting that council have made numerous attempts to contact Mr Russell Parkinson from Dines Group to get the pathway 'quoted' and sorted out for the residents. It is now some 4 months since the developers were again approached and 12 months since Mr Parkinson was getting costings together! It was suggested that the WDC contact Colin Botica to follow up.

#### Double Yellow Lines Helenslee Road 'bend'

Kevin will follow up as these lines were supposed to have been painted in March. Council waiting for surveyors reports re property boundaries before any tree trimming can take place on this bend.



#### **Toilets**

Kevin informed the meeting that cubicle screens (between Men's/Women's entrances)were to be installed and that there was also a paint upgrade .Helen suggested we look at those colour options at our May meeting.

#### Cemetery Design

Nothing yet re design. Pokeno ,Tuakau,Onewhero, residents and Community groups will be consulted via a WDC community projects team workshops at some stage in the future.

#### Bus Stops.

Kevin tabled the 'route' Map for the new Pokeno, Tuakau, Pukekohe bus service. The Bus route is to start in September and will have Buses every 45minutes during Peak hours, every 3 hours non-Peak and on Saturdays and Sundays every 6 hours each way.

# Street Lights (Main Street)

Kevin informed the PCC that all the main street lights will be replaced by LED's and that Banner poles would be ericted on the right hand roadsideTo be completed new season October.

# Supermarket Update

The supermarket submissions go to council in late April and will be publicly notified .Kevin informed PCC that Wellington street is the preferred entrance ,not Great South Road. Full set of visuals at next meeting in May .Proposed start date is October 2019 at this stage.

#### **Community Projects**

Tata Developments are proposing an upgrade to the boat ramp at Mercer .Kevin informed us.It is only at the 'infancy' stage, more funding is required and additional contribution probably needed. Work in progress continues with all groups involved.

Helen Clotworthy informed him that as a community, we were very involved in our street naming and our history. The process of street naming was explained and that the community was involved

The 'poppies' will be erected for the ANZAC service/parade at 2pm on the 18<sup>th</sup> .Janet Mc Robbie commented that it would be nice if WDC staff could get the planning timeline correct for planting the gardens to correspond with the service of commemoration at the memorial

Footpath	Megan	Need to investigate footpath 30 metres between Zig Zag Hillpark Drive (?) and Mill Hill Crescent (?) behind the wetlands.  As per last month Zig Zag Hillpark Drive and Mill Hill Crescent Behind Wetlands.  There is no footpath linking the Zig Zag path to the other concrete path, is this to be formed by the developer? Could this be a boardwalk?	This walkway was created by the developer. Investigations are needed to determine if it should have been concrete but due to the terrain it is on, concreting it may not have been feasible.  Further investigation will occur.  NOVEMBER: Staff have looked into the area between the zigzag hill path and the walkway detailed on the map.  Due to the terrain and access issues, the cost to install and maintain a walkway in this area will likely be very expensive. Staff will have this job quoted and once received will determine if this path is the best use of ratepayers money or if there are other walkways that would be more beneficial to the community and therefore will have a higher priority.  DECEMBER: Council staff have met with developers to look at options for walkway development. Currently awaiting quotes for different options and depending on pricing, may result in one of the following:  Retaining wall installed, grass path widened and will be maintained by being mown  Boardwalk built to widen the path  Gravel walkway widened  An update will be provided once quotes are received.

# **Boat Ramps**

#### Mercer

Meeting with contractor to discuss extent of works required to enable a quote to be received as agreement with developer has yet to be confirmed. Intention is for works to be completed to take advantage of low river levels at present.

# Pokeno Rd Urban Upgrades

#### Pokeno Road Urban Upgrade

The first upgrade section runs from outside the school on Pokeno Road to the intersection with Great South Road. Currently preparing information for consultation, and obtaining pricing for the stormwater system construction.

# Pokeno Wastewater Connections Stage 3

A contractor to complete the remainder of the works has indicated they would like to submit a quote for the work as they will have some availability. Inspection undertaken, quote to be received shortly.

# **Toilets**

#### Pokeno Toilet

Schedules have been developed for the refurbishment of the toilet block to go to market for costing and award of contract. The refurbishment is expected to increase the useful life of the existing public toilet block by 5-10 years to allow for further planning around Pokeno town centre.

WSP Opus have provided the draft Catchment Management Plan and provided a presentation to go through the document. Staff are providing comments and requests for any additional information needed.

# **Sportsgrounds**

Munro Road Sportsground


Resource consent was approved February 2017 to carry out the earthworks to re-align the stream and create a flat mowable surface in which sports fields can be constructed along with hardcourt areas.

Work on this project was put on hold due to concerns that development of this area along with other significant residential developments underway will have a significant effect on stormwater management within the catchment. Following the receipt of the draft Catchment Management Plan report from Opus confirming that the sportspark construction designed by Harrison Grierson will have no significant impact on the stormwater management in that catchment, work is underway to progress this project.

The design drawings will now be reviewed with a view to advertising an earthworks contract in two stages. Stage I will be to strip and stockpile the topsoil for later use, construct the new stream alignment (all cut material to be placed in areas requiring fill) and plant establishment before making this stream diversion live at final completion. Stage 2A will be to continue to cut all high areas and place material in areas requiring fill between the existing stream and new stream alignments.

The contract will exclude stage 2B which is currently being investigated, whether an appropriate solution to provide the needed imported material is by implementation of a commercial clean fill site. Once all imported material has been placed to the final design level the new stream alignment will be made operational and the old stream bead infilled under stage 3.


#### **Cemeteries**

# Whangarata Road Cemetery

The design for consent has been lodged for assessment and is currently being reviewed. Consent on the current design was lodged within WDC as there is a pending District Plan review which if passed will see the status for the construction of Cemeteries heightened from "Controlled Activity" to "Discretionary Activity" meaning that all previous consultation will be invalidated, and there is the potential for Discretionary Activities to be declined completely.

It has been noted that further consultation may be required however WDC do not feel this will effect Stage I of the cemetery construction. Consultation is believed to be targeted at types and locations of burial plots which has no effect on consents, as well as the possibility of a future privately owned crematorium. Crematoriums are not part of WDC's strategic planning and operations and would only be undertaken by a private investor. Consent to operate such a facility will therefore require the private investor to obtain their own consent and consideration of location agreed with WDC. This may be carried out under the future Stage II.

WDC have undertaken road widening and safety improvements of this intersection in conjunction with the Waikato District Alliance (WDA) rehabilitation works on a cost share basis. This was to reduce the overall cost to the cemetery project and minimise the risk of later re-work being required. Some minor changes to the linemarking layout may be required pending consent conditions however this will coincide with the WDA reseal programme during their scheduled second coat seal.






