# 3. BACKGROUND

The Dynamo Cycling and Sports Club is hosting the 2020 Road Cycling Event - Race three of the Dynamo Team Championships (six race series).

The event will take place Sunday 22 November 2020, starting at the Rugby League Clubrooms in Ngaruawahia, riders will journey through Huntly, Glen Murray, Whaingaroa and Glen Massey before finishing at the start line.

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The Team Championships has 60 plus teams taking part in seven different grades, with the grades providing opportunity for riders to compete in a range of events applicable to their skill level.

It is anticipated 350 - 390 competitors will participate, with in excess of 250 supporters in Ngaruawahia, attracting 500 people outside the region and promoting the Waikato district. People have the opportunity to explore local attractions and activities, such as the Te Awa Cycleway.

40 volunteers help out with this event. Considerable existing funds will contribute towards required funds and various Gaming Trusts will be approached too.

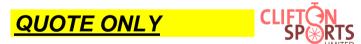

#### 1. **Statement of Accounting Policies**

#### **Entity Reporting**

These financial statements are for DYNAMO CYCLING & SPORTS CLUB INCORPORATED.

#### **Statement of Compliance and Basis of Preparation**

The Special Purpose Financial Statements of DYNAMO CYCLING & SPORTS CLUB INCORPORATED, have been prepared in accordance with the stated accounting policies. The accounting principles recognised as appropriate for the measurement and reporting of earnings and financial position on a historical cost and accrual basis have been applied. The Special Purpose Financial Statements of DYNAMO CYCLING & SPORTS CLUB INCORPORATED, are prepared to meet the requirements of Rules of the Society.

#### **Measurement Base**

The accounting principle recognised as appropriate for the measurement and reporting of earnings and financial position on a historical cost basis are followed by the entity. Reliance is placed on the fact that the entity is a going concern.

# **Specific Accounting Policies**

# (c) Depreciation

Depreciation has been calculated using the maximum rates allowed for taxation purposes. The particular rates and method of depreciation applied are as recorded on the Statement of Fixed Assets & Depreciation. A contingent taxation liability exists on any depreciation that may be recovered on the sale of Fixed Assets.

#### (d) Intangible & Other Assets

Intangible & Other Assets are recorded at cost, less amortisation in accordance with rates available under the Income Tax Act.
