APPLICATIONS FOR FUNDING – PRESENTATION BY APPLICANTS

<u>Art in Nature Arboretum Trust – Sculpture Park</u> Agenda Item 6.1

Ms Dorothy Wakeling from the Art in Nature Arboretum Trust noted the following matters:

- The Waikato District Council had a long history and extensive involvement with the Trust.
- The application related specifically to the production of education materials to enhance the Trust's ability to work with families and collaborate with schools.
- The material would provide activities for families and enable them to interact with the environment in a creative way.
- Many schools had been very restricted around taking pupils on day trips (as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic). Consequently, educational handbooks/material for teachers required and update.
- Requested for funds to also assist with the facilitation of workshops, in addition to upgrading an educational handbook and an interactive board for families to pick out resources they want to use in the park.

<u>Whatawhata Rural Fund – Whatawhata Community Facility</u> Agenda Item 6.2

Mr Glen McLennan from the Whatawhata Community Committee noted the following matters:

- The Whatawhata Community Centre had been the Whatawhata Community Committee's most significant project to date.
- The Whatawhata Community Facility's kitchen had required renovation for a long period of time.
- The application was about the Whatawhata Community Committee trying to get the facility project over the line.
- Mr McLennan would continue to seek alternate funding sources if Council was unable to assist.
- Cr Smith noted the Whatawhata Community Committee initially secured sufficient funding for the facility in general, but not enough to fit it out. The Committee had made a decision to get the project as far as it could go initially, with the knowledge some components would be unfunded at first.

DELIBERATIONS BY THE COMMITTEE

The following discussion was held:

- Committee queried if the application would be better placed in the events fund.
- Staff confirmed it did fit within the framework of the Discretionary and Funding Committee and was within scope.
- Cr Lynch proposed the Committee commit \$3,500 for the Art in Nature Arboretum Trust's application and \$12,000 for the Whatawhata Community Committee's application. It would deplete the Rural Fund, but the money would be contributing to worthy causes.

Purpose & Mission

To effectively administer the facility for the benefit of the members and individuals who participate in the sport regardless of levels of ability. Along with conducting Regional, Island, National and International events.

To follow recognised rules for competition within the various shooting disciplines, with particular emphasis on safety, fair competition and etiquette.

To foster the growth of the sport by investing in an extensive junior coaching programme that includes two annual scholarships for High School aged members. Also to provide coaching assistance for senior members.

The fund a mental driver of success of the Club is the commitment of volunteers, management and members to the Clubs growth, enjoyment of the environment and financial security.

To organise and oversee the major championship events at:

- Provincial championships on rotation for the Waikato region
- Island championships on rotation for the North Island
- National championships biannually with the South Island for DTL.
- National Championships for simulated field competitions
- ISSF (Olympic Disciplines) championships including National and International championships.

About Us

The Waikato Gun Club was established in 1975 following the logical amalgamation of several local clubs whom had the foresight to recognise that Waikato Clay Target Shooters would be better served by a single multi discipline facility. The property is situated on fifty hectares, 5 kilometres from Hamilton City on Holland Road.

The club now has around 200 registered members and provides services to the New Zealand Clay Target Association and New Zealand Shooting Federation, in the form of running Secondary School, Provincial, Island, National, Oceania and International Championship events. Currently Waikato Clay Target Club grounds are designated as the National Training facility for Shotgun Sports along with being one of two National grounds.

Within the last two years the Club was renamed the Waikato Clay Target Club Inc. (WCTC) to better reflect the activities conducted on the grounds.

The Clubs facilities include 10 DTL fields, 5 Skeet fields, 3 Ball Trap fields, 1 ISSF Trench Layout, 1 ISSF Double Trap Layout, 1 ISSF Skeet Layout and various Sporting areas - all fields are automated. These layouts cater for all disciplines of clay target shooting.

Clubrooms include a licensed bar, ammunition sales, firearms storage, meeting room and cafeteria. WCTC provides powered campervan/caravan sites & tent sites for visitors to stay on the grounds during events. The facility holds all the required consents to conduct the relevant activities of the Club.

Services

Recently the club has undertaken significant redevelopment to position the club amongst the leading shooting grounds in Australasia. We are a well patronised and busy facility that offers a broad range of disciplines which will suit everybody, from the very competitive shooter to the recreational. The Waikato Clay Target club conducts regular DTL, Skeet, ISSF Trap Shooting and Sporting competitions each month and practice on Saturday's and Thursday evening's.

New members or informal shooters are always welcome, our rules let you take part in two of our shoots without becoming a member, then membership applies and with it affiliation to the NZ Clay Target Association.

WCTC members, through both teams and individuals, have achieved remarkable results in recent years. This includes two members, Nadine Stanton and Erin Discombe who both competed at the 2006 Commonwealth Games. WCTC members have a proud history of success in juniors and seniors, North Island, National and International Championship titles.

The sport of clay target shooting is one of the very few sports in which Junior's, Women, Physically Disabled, Veterans and Men in the open grade can compete on a completely even basis. The sport involves good eye-hand co-ordination, skill, concentration, good equipment and determination. For these reasons, the sport has become very popular with secondary school competitors.

Clay target shooting involves the shooting of targets thrown by a "trap" machine through the air. Shotguns are used to attempt to break the target for the best possible score to win an event at any level, be it at club, district, provincial, island, national or even international competitions. The goal and objective of every competitor is to win at their level of ability in competition.

To represent New Zealand at the Olympic and Commonwealth Games is the goal of some shooters, regretfully these numbers are limited primarily due to the lack of funding available. A transition to the ISSF events is required and although administered by the NZCTA and its member clubs, the individual shooters come under NZ Shooting Federation for major international competitions.

The sport of clay target shooting has seen a very considerable growth in membership from the Secondary School age groups, some 1200 are registered nationally. For these individuals there are regular inter-collegiate competitions and at the 2011 Secondary School Nationals held at the WCTC, some 320 students competed over three days.

WCTC facilities are utilised by several of the local Colleges and these competitors have enjoyed success at the highest level of junior shooting (Secondary School Nationals).

These different forms of clay target shooting provide variety to suit a range of preferences for members of the WCTC. The grading system allows competitors to compete against each other on an equitable basis that accounts for experience, skill and abilities. As the sport is not reliant on size or strength, competitors of all ages and both genders can compete on an equal basis.

Sporting shooters can compete at club competitions or majors sporting championship events. From these championship events the teams to represent New Zealand are selected.

Description of Entity's Outcomes

The Waikato Gun Club was established in 1975 following the logical amalgamation of several local clubs whom had the foresight to recognise that Waikato Clay Target Shooters would be better served by a single multi discipline facility. The property is situated on fifty hectares, 5 kilometres from Hamilton City on Holland Road.

The club now has around 200 registered members and provides services to the New Zealand Clay Target Association and New Zealand Shooting Federation, in the form of running Secondary School, Provincial, Island, National, Oceania and International Championship events. Currently Waikato Clay Target Club grounds are designated as the National Training facility for Shotgun Sports along with being one of two National grounds.

Within the latter years the Club was renamed the Waikato Clay Target Club Inc. (WCTC) to better reflect the activities conducted on the grounds.

The Clubs facilities include 12 DTL fields, 6 Skeet fields, 3 Ball Trap fields, 1 ISSF Trench Layout, 1 ISSF Double Trap Layout, 1 ISSF Skeet Layout and various Sporting areas - all fields are automated. These layouts cater for all disciplines of clay target shooting.

The facility holds all the required consents to conduct the relevant activities of the Club. The primary roles of the WCTC are:

- To effectively administer the facility for the benefit of the members and individuals who participate in the sport regardless
 of levels of ability. Along with conducting Regional, Island, National and International events.
- To follow recognised rules for competition within the various shooting disciplines (detailed later), with particular emphasis on safety, fair competition and etiquette.
- 3. To organise and oversee the major championship events at:
 - Provincial championships on rotation for the Waikato region
 - Island championships on rotation for the North Island
 - National championships biannually with the South Island for DTL.
 - National Championships for simulated field competitions
 - ISSF (Olympic Disciplines) championships including National and International championships.
- To foster the growth of the sport by investing in an extensive junior coaching programme that includes two annual scholarships for High School aged shooters. Also to provide coaching assistance for senior members.

Recent Results and Achievements

The fundamental driver of success of the Club is the commitment of volunteers, management and members to the Clubs growth, enjoyment of the environment and financial security.

Huntly Golf Club has a membership of approximately 200 full and restricted members. Over recent years the membership had declined to the point the club sold the land and buildings to a member in order to free up funds to maintain the viability of the club. At present the club leases back the premises while maintaining ownership of the infrastructure required to maintain the course.

The club is now slowly increasing its membership with particular attention to the now thriving junior schools program in partnership with Genesis and the Sport Waikato Te Manawa program

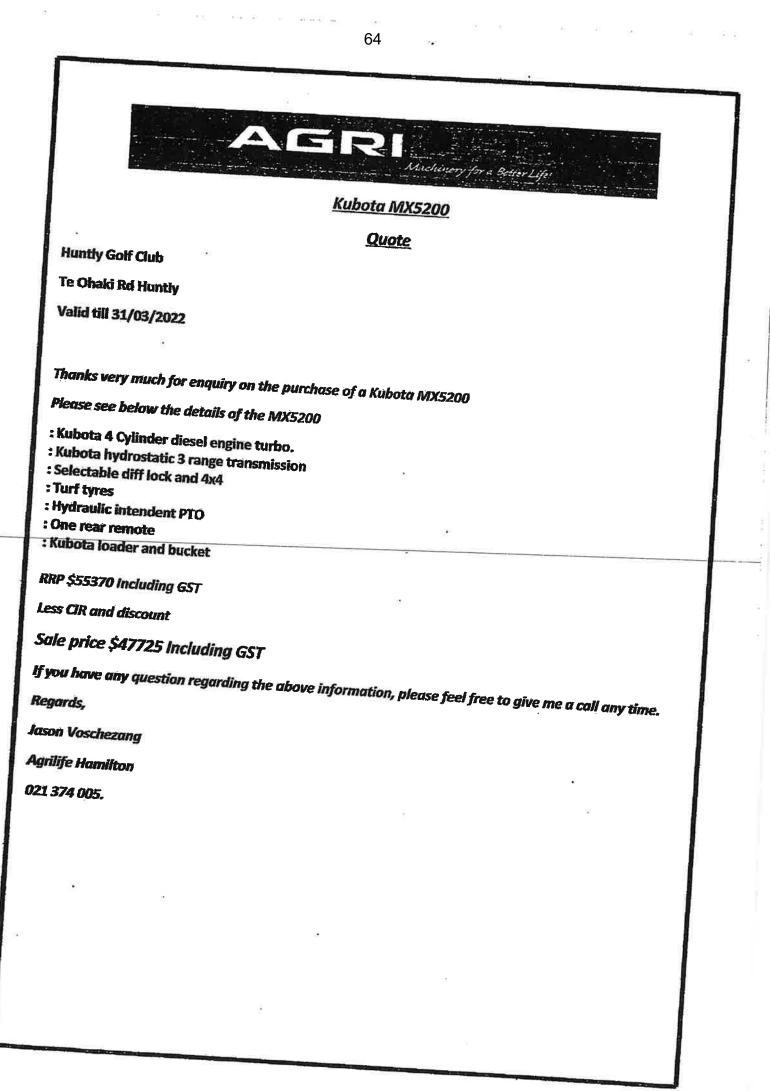
The funds realized from the sale are required for the day to day running of the club and to drive an increase in membership.
