## Purpose

A general review of the Rāhui Pōkeka wastewater treatment plant was provided. The consent for the plant expires in 2029 and the LTP has funding to upgrade the WWTP within the same time.

With the Sleepyhead Development in Ohinewai requiring wastewater to be sent to a compliant plant, the WWTP requires updating sooner to support the development. The WWTP is currently non-compliant. The noncompliance exists in the 90<sup>th</sup> percentile for ammoniacal nitrogen. To support the Sleepyhead development and improve environmental compliance, Council would like to have the early design and resource consent requirements agreed by June 2023 and the plant completed within the 2026 financial year.

With mana whenua insight and in the spirit of te ture whaimana, te tiriti o te waitangi and te mana o te wai and te mana o te awa, Council would like to continue the partnership to ensure that the future of the Rāhui Pōkeka WWTP Upgrade respects and considers mātauranga māori as we look to renew the resource consent and develop the concept design of the WWTP.

This group will come together regularly to discuss all aspects of the Rāhui Pōkeka WWTP Upgrade to enable alignment of views and the appropriate outcomes for all parties to be achieved. To enable this, Council has had funding bought forward and approved. \$2.1 million has been allocated towards concept design and resource consent.

## Minutes

Opening by Keith Martin.

Review of last minutes provided and accepted.

Given the size of investment for the WWTP Council will consider reapplying for the consent early to enable the design and treatment outcome to be certain beyond the current expiry of 2029.

Taroi confirmed that Waikato Tainui's desire for the WWTP discharge was consistent with Te Ture Whaimana, They would like no more partially treated discharge during storm events and as an ultimate goal having wastewater treated to drinking water quality.

Discussion was held on reuse. It was agreed that there was a potential opportunity to reuse the treated waste water although a clear target was not immediately identified. The nursery beside Ngaruawahia was identified although not directly related to Rāhui Pōkeka WWTP upgrade.

The conversation in respect to how the impact of the WWTP on the Whenua could be addressed has not been advanced but the general principals previously discussed remain. These are;

- I. Council contributing to a restoration fund, with funding used for riverbank restoration. Commitment of iwi to restore, through planting XX metres per year of river bank through the lifetime of WWTP and consent. Funding to be inflation linked and rolled over into future years if restoration efforts unable to be fully completed.

2. Tuna in the WWTP ponds need to be returned to the Awa. Before a catch and release program can be completed, the tuna need to be cleansed. It is proposed that the tuna living in the WWTP ponds are trapped and placed into the flooded old east mine pit for a period of 12 months

Taroi advised he had resigned as CE for Waikato Tainui and his tenure would cease at the end of the week.
