28 Recreation Zone Rules

The rules in this chapter apply in the Recreation Zone. This chapter is divided into:

- Introduction
- Prohibited Activities
- Other Activities
 - Land Use Activities rule table
 - Land Use Effects rule table
 - Land Use Building rule table
 - Subdivision rule table.

28.2

The Recreation Zone comprises land owned by Waikato District Council for the purposes of public sports grounds that have clubrooms and other large scale recreational and sports facilities. The Council will manage activities under the Reserves Act. Small neighbourhood parks and reserves are not included in the zone. Rules seek to manage activities so that any adverse effects do not detract from the amenity values of each locality. Mitigation of impacts on surrounding Living Zone areas is provided for.

28.3

See Chapter 18 for explanation of activity types, applications and assessment procedures. Principal reasons for rules are in Chapter 29.

Any activity is permitted if it is not listed as prohibited, and it complies with conditions for permitted activities stated in every row of the rule tables.

Any activity requires resource consent if it fails to comply with a permitted activity condition in any row of the rule tables, or the rules directly state that a resource consent category applies.

Rule tables consist of horizontal rows. Each row contains 3 cells. In each row, the left hand cell indicates the subject matter, the middle cell states conditions that must be satisfied for the relevant activity or effect to be a permitted activity, and the right hand cell states the kind of resource consent application required, if the permitted activity conditions in that row are not complied with.

The rule table state matters that control is reserved over, and matters to which discretion is restricted, as appropriate. Additional matters of control and discretion, applicable to every rule are stated in Chapter 20: General Rules.

Schedule 28A: Tamahere Recreation Zone and Village Green Rules

28A.1 Application of the Schedule

The rules in this schedule apply to the Tamahere Recreation Zone and Village Green, which is located within the Tamahere Structure Plan area as shown on the Planning Map. The schedule also includes design guidelines to facilitate future development.

28A.2 Rules applying in the Tamahere Recreation Zone and Village Green

In addition to the following rules, all rules in Chapter 28: Recreation Zone also apply in the Tamahere Recreation Zone except for rules 28.10, 28.38, 28.39, 28.40 and in Village Green, 28.10, 28.15, 28.35, 28.37, 28.38, 28.39, 28.40, 28.49A.

28A.3 Tamahere Recreation Zone and Village Green

Schedule 28A sets out rules which provide for development within the Tamahere Recreation Zone and the Village Green. The schedule provides for the land to be developed in accordance with the relevant rules in both the schedule and, where not specifically excluded, the Recreation Zone rules in Chapter 28. The schedule also requires development to be in accordance with the Tamahere Village Design Guide and Tamahere Village Concept Plan.

The Tamahere Recreation Area and the Village Green are identified on the planning map as 'Information Only' for clarification of the location and extent of the area.

It is envisaged that a community recreational area, including a village green, will be developed that will integrate with the adjoining retail development and support an attractive and lively community hub. Recreation facilities should be attractively designed, easily accessible and physically and visually connected to the surrounding environment. The recreational facilities will be developed as and when the community requires them.

The Village Green is a Council owned facility which forms part of the Tamahere Recreation Area and will provide for a town square or piazza style development. The Village Green will complement the Tamahere Village Business Zone and will be designed and constructed in accordance with the Tamahere Village Design Guide and Concept Plan. This will enable consistency with building and landscape design in relation to the adjoining recreation and retail developments and will ensure the open space character of the Village Green is achieved and maintained.

It is anticipated that the Village Green will be developed at the same time as the first stage of any retail development. The purpose of the Village Green is that it will be utilised by the community as a public facility for everyday use, providing a community hub melding the business and recreation areas, as well as providing for temporary events such as market days and festivals.

The land within the Tamahere Recreation Zone will be vested as recreation reserve and be subject to a Reserve Management Plan.
